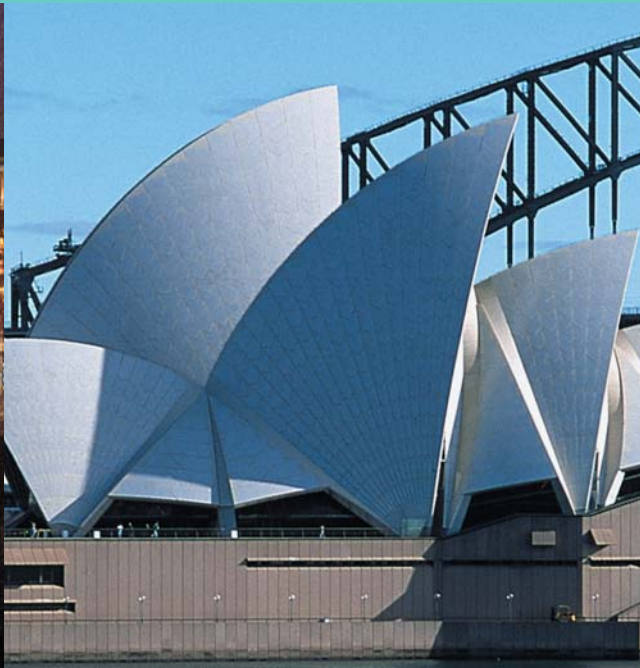

He lectured in North and South America, Europe, Asia, Africa and Australia

Dieter Drescher



Prof. Drescher studied dentistry from 1977 to 1982 at the University of Bonn. He received his doctor degree from the University of Bonn in 1984. From 1984 to 1988 he attended the postgraduate course in orthodontics at the University of Bonn and became a certified

Sarandeep Huja



Dr. Sarandeep Huja is the Division Chief of Orthodontics at the University of Kentucky. Dr. Huja initially received his dental and orthodontic training from India. From 1993-2001, he was associated with three US institutions, receiving his MS (1995) from Marquette University, Milwaukee, his PhD (1999) and Orthodontic Certificate (1999) from Indiana University, Indianapolis and his DDS (2001) from University of Nebraska Medical Centre College of Dentistry, Lincoln. He has been and currently is PI/Co-I on grants from the NIDCR, NIA, American Academy of Implant Dentistry, Delta Dental and the American Association of Orthodontist Foundation. His research seeks to understand bone remodelling and adaptation to physical forces. His clinical interests include skeletal anchorage, biomechanics of tooth movement and an interdisciplinary focus to treating patients with compromised malocclusions. He is an Orthodontic consultant to the Commission on Dental Accreditation. He is currently on the Editorial Review Board of the Angle Orthodontist, American

Journal of Orthodontics, Journal of Dental Biomechanics. Dr. Huja is a member of the Angle Society and a Diplomat of the American Board of Orthodontics. Dr. Huja maintains an intramural faculty practice.

Yasuhiro Itsuki

Dr. Kharbanda earned his BDS (1976) with honours from King George's Medical College Lucknow followed by MDS Orthodontics (1978). Later he completed his MOrthRCS (Edinburgh) and Masters in Medical Education (M MED) from the University of Dundee. Dr. Kharbanda has been a postgraduate teacher since 1986 and has supervised more than 60 theses at AIIMS and at University of Sydney where he served from 2000-2003. His book entitled 'Orthodontics: Diagnosis and Management of Malocclusion and Dentofacial Deformities': Elsevier 2009, has become popular in a short time. Dr. Kharbanda has authored/co-authored more than 110 papers/case reports/ book chapters in peer reviewed international and national journals. Dr. Kharbanda is a former Chief Editor of Journal of Indian Orthodontic Society and is on board of a number of international orthodontic journals. Dr. Kharbanda is Past President of Indian Orthodontic Society and Indian Cleft lip Palate and Craniofacial Association. Currently he is Co-chair 8th Asian Pacific Orthodontic Conference 2012. Since 2004 his team is aggressively involved in clinical and fundamental research on host and implant related factors contributing to the success of orthodontic miniscrew implants.

Sunny Seong-Hun Kim



Seong-Hun Kim, DMD, MSD, PhD is an Associate Professor of the Department of Orthodontics School of Dentistry, Kyung Hee University. He is also a visiting assistant professor of the Division of Orthodontics, Department of Orofacial Sciences at University of California, San Francisco (UCSF). Dr. Kim obtained an Orthodontic certificate and MS in Department of Orthodontics, School of Dentistry at the Kyung Hee University, Seoul, Korea, and PhD in Department of Orthodontics, School of Dentistry at the Seoul National University, Seoul, Korea. He is currently the Editor of Clinical Affairs in the Korean Journal of Orthodontics (SCIE journal) in Seoul, Korea and also the editorial reviewer board in the American Journal of Orthodontics and Dentofacial Orthopedics, The Angle Orthodontist, Orthodontics and Craniofacial Research, Saudi Medical Journal, International Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Implants (SCI journal), and Journal of World Federation of Orthodontists (JWFO). He is a member of World Federation of Orthodontists (WFO) and Korean Society of Speedy Orthodontics (KSSO). Dr. Kim lectures and presents seminars in the United States and internationally about this topic. He also teaches and lectures at UCSF School of Dentistry about implant orthodontics, and he is the author of five international text books and over 120 international and domestic scientific articles about this topic.

Tae-Woo Kim



Tae-Woo KIM is Professor in Orthodontics, Seoul National University, where he completed his orthodontic specialty training in 1986. He was a visiting professor (1995-7) of University of Washington. He was an editor-in-chief of Korean Journal of Orthodontics (KJO). He is Vice president of Korean Association of Orthodontics. He works as a reviewer of KJO, AJODO and other famous international journals. His focused research fields are TMD, mini-implants and long-term stability.

A.M. Kuijpers-Jagtman



Anne Marie Kuijpers-Jagtman has been Professor and Chairperson of the Department of Orthodontics and Craniofacial Biology at the Radboud University Nijmegen, The Netherlands, since 1995. Professor Kuijpers-Jagtman is Councillor of the World Federation of Orthodontists (WFO).

In 2002 she was honoured with the Fellowship in Dental Surgery by Election of the Royal College of Surgeons of England, in 2004 she received the Cesare Luzzi Memorial Award of SIDO in Italy, and in 2011 the Swiss Paul Herren Award. She was awarded Knight in the Order of Orange-Nassau (Royal Honour of Her Majesty the Queen) for services to cleft lip and palate in 2007. In

2009 and 2011 her group received the Samuel Berkowitz Award of the American Cleft Palate Craniofacial Association for the best publication on long-term results of cleft lip and palate treatment. Professor Kuijpers-Jagtman is Editor-in-Chief of Orthodontics and Craniofacial Research. She has undertaken extensive research during the last 25 years in the areas of cleft lip and palate and the biological background of orthodontics. In recent years, her major interests have been in 3D-imaging in orthodontics and evidence based orthodontic therapy. She (co)authored over 260 publications in Medline on her main topics of interest.

Shingo Kuroda



Dr. Shingo Kuroda is the Associate Professor of Department of Orthodontics and Dentofacial Orthopedics at the University of Tokushima Graduate School. He is a Diplomate of the Japanese Orthodontic Board and a member of the International review board for American Journal of Orthodontics and Dentofacial Orthopedics. After a postgraduate course at Osaka University, he was an Assistant Professor in Okayama University for 8 years. Since 2009, he has worked at Université de Montréal for 2 years, as a visiting researcher under Professor Antonio Nanci in Laboratory for the Study of Calcified Tissues and Biomaterials and a clinical instructor in Section of Orthodontics.

Hee-Moon Kyung



Dr. Hee-Moon Kyung is Professor and Chair of the Department of Orthodontics at Kyungpook National University in Daegu, Korea. Dr. Kyung is one of the most experienced clinicians in the development and utilization of microimplants in orthodontic treatment worldwide. He has given more than 200 courses throughout world about microimplant anchorage and lingual orthodontic treatment. He is a principle author of the book entitled Microimplants in Orthodontics, a volume that describes in detail the protocols used by Dr. Kyung and his colleagues. He is an active member of Angle Society.

Seung-Hyun Kyung



Dr Laursen received his dental degree from Aarhus University in 2001 and became a certified orthodontist in 2007. Dr Laursen works part time as a clinical Assistant Professor at the Department of Orthodontics, Aarhus University and part time in private and public orthodontic offices.

At the Department of Orthodontics, Aarhus University Dr Laursen is involved in the treatment of patients with special needs and he teaches post-graduate students. His research is concentrated on the dento-alveolar bone complex in relation to orthodontic tooth movement and insertion of mini-implants.

Kee-Joon Lee



Dr. Kee-Joon Lee received DDS and PhD degree from Graduate school, College of Dentistry, Yonsei University, Seoul, Korea. He is currently an associate professor at Department of Orthodontics, Yonsei University, also an adjunct professor at Temple University, Philadelphia, PA.

He contributed book chapters on biomechanics of miniscrew-driven orthodontics and related non-extraction treatment in adults. He has published many articles and case reports regarding miniscrew implants in orthodontic journals including two cover issues in AJO-DO. His fields in research include clinical biomechanics regarding TADs application and the suture biology in normal growth and in FGFR2-related congenital deformity.

Jang Yeol Lee



Dr. Lee is currently co-director of the Smileagain orthodontic center in Seoul, Korea. He is Clinical Professor in Department of Orthodontics, Yonsei University, Seoul, Korea and also Clinical Professor in Department of Orthodontics, Samsung Medical Center,

Sungkunkwan University, Seoul, Korea and Associate Fellow in the Department of Orthodontics, University of Warwick, UK. He received his dental and orthodontic education at Yonsei University, Seoul, Korea and completed his master and Ph. D degrees in the same school. Dr. Lee is also a visiting scholar in the department of orthodontics, school of dentistry at the University of North Carolina, USA.

Dr Lee was the Secretary General of the 4th Asian Implant Orthodontic Conference in Seoul, 2005 and he was also the Secretary General of the organizing committee in the 1st World Implant Orthodontic Conference held in 2008. Currently he holds a position of Secretary General of World Implant Orthodontic Association.

James Cheng-Yi Lin



Dr. Lin is a Clinical Assistant Professor at the School of Dentistry at the National Defense Medical University of Taipei, Taiwan. He is a member of the editorial review boards of Journal of Taiwan Association of Orthodontists, Journal of Clinical Orthodontics, International

Journal of Medicine Medical Sciences and International Journal of Case Reports and Images. He is a Diplomate of the Taiwan Association of Orthodontists, Taiwan Academy of Aesthetic Dentistry, Taiwan Formosa Academy of Implant Dentistry, and Japanese Society of aesthetic Dentistry, a fellow of the American Association of Orthodontists, World Federation of Orthodontists, International Conference of Oral Implantologists and other professional organisations. He is the current Secretary General of Taiwan Academy of Aesthetic Dentistry. Dr. Lin has been involved with postgraduate teaching at the

Chang Gung University, Taipei Medical University and National Defense Medical University. His main fields of interest focus in TADs-anchored orthodontics and overall aesthetics-driven interdisciplinary treatment. He has developed and patented orthodontic miniscrew products which greatly increase the success for orthodontic anchorage. He has authored or co-authored several articles and book chapters related to TADs-anchored orthodontics as well as aesthetic interdisciplinary treatment dentistry.

Dr. Lin lectures both nationally and internationally, and holds a private practice centered on orthodontics, implant dentistry and overall aesthetics-driven interdisciplinary treatment for adult patients in Taipei, Taiwan.

Eric Liou



Dr. Eric Liou is an association professor and the deputy chairman in the Faculty of Dentistry, Chang Gung Memorial Hospital & Chang Gung University, Taipei, Taiwan. He is also a visiting professor in the Department of Orthodontics, Showa University, Tokyo, Japan. For the

professional affiliations, Dr. Liou is currently the deputy president of Taiwan association of Orthodontists, and president elect of the World Implant Orthodontic Association. His main research interests are distraction osteogenesis, TADs, orthodontic tooth movement, platelet rich plasma, and bone physiology. Dr. Liou has numerous publications and presentations, specially on the topics of accelerated orthodontic tooth movement, maxillary orthopedic protraction, surgery first accelerated orthognathic surgery, and TADs.

Bjorn Ludwig



Dr Bjorn Ludwig has his own private orthodontic practice in Traben-Trarbach, Germany. He is scientific coordinator and Assistant Professor of the University of Homburg/Saar, Department of Orthodontics.

He teaches in the program of further education for orthodontics in the Association of Dentists and the University of Frankfurt/Main (Erasmus). His focus of research work is cortical anchorage with mini-screws and their further clinical development. He has published more than 80 scientific papers about miniscrews, cleft palate and interdisciplinary cases. Dr Ludwig gives lectures and hands-on courses about mini-screws and lingual treatment worldwide. He has contributed chapters in books and is also editor of the book "Mini-implants in orthodontics", Quintessenz, Berlin, London and the book "Selfligating brackets-treatment and concepts" Thieme, Stuttgart, New York.

As well as doing reviews for some major journals, he is contributing editor of the journal of clinical orthodontics, IOK and scientific editor of German orthodontic tribune.

Birte Melsen

Professor Melsen has held the title of Professor and Head of the Department of Orthodontics at The School of Dentistry, Aarhus University, Denmark since 1975. She has been working part-time in a private practice in Lübeck, Germany (Adult Orthodontics only) since 1986.

Professor Melsen has authored more than 350 publications in the fields of growth and development based on research of human autopsy material, bone biology and clinical implant studies. In recent years her professional interests have focused primarily on the fields of Skeletal Anchorage, Virtual Imaging and Adult Orthodontic Treatment.

In 2000 she received the Knighthood of Dannebrog 1st degree.

Camillo Morea



Dr. Camillo Morea is professor at the Specialty course in Orthodontics of the FUNDECTO – University of São Paulo, Brazil and Post-doctoral fellow at the Orthodontics Department of the University of São Paulo, Brazil. His primary interest is orthodontic mini-implants in all their

aspects including surgical technique, use of surgical guides and prototyped surgical guides. He has conducted research on histological aspects of mini-implants healing. Moreover, Dr. Morea has published several journal articles and book chapters.

Ravindra Nanda



Dr. Ravindra Nanda is at present UConn Alumni Endowed Chair, and Professor and Head of the Department of Craniofacial Sciences and Chair of division of Orthodontics, University of Connecticut, Farmington, Connecticut, U.S.A.

Dr. Nanda has done extensive research during the last forty years in the areas of cleft lip and palate, orthopedic forces and on long-term growth with orthognathic surgery in adolescents. In recent years, his major thrust has been in development of orthodontic wires, clinical orthodontic trials and application of biomechanics in a busy orthodontic practice. Dr. Nanda has been author and co-author of five orthodontic books and more than one hundred scientific and clinical articles in major journals. He is on the editorial board of ten different national and international orthodontic journals. He is an associate editor of Journal of Clinical Orthodontics.

He is an active member of various organizations, including the American Association of Orthodontists, European Orthodontic Society and Edward H. Angle Society. Dr. Nanda is a Diplomate of the American Board of Orthodontics. He has given numerous named lectures at national and international societies including Mershon Lecture at American Association of Orthodontics and Sheldon Friel Lecture at 2011 EOS Conference.

Junji Ohtani



Dr. Junji Ohtani is Assistant professor, Department of Orthodontics, at the Hiroshima University in Japan, since 2006. He is also a visiting professor of the Department of Craniofacial Anomalies at University of California, San Francisco (UCSF). He received

his dental education at Aichi gakuin University and completed PhD degree in Hiroshima University. Author of publications on national and international journals and books mainly devoted on orthodontics and the relationship with nutrition and bone.

Young-Chel Park

Dr. John R Smith earned his B.S. degree in Zoology from the University of Florida in 1971 and his D.D.S. degree in 1975 from Emory University. Graduating first in his dental class earned him the distinguished Alpha Omega Scholastic Award and membership into the Omicron Kappa Upsilon Scholastic Society. Perhaps the most notable achievement in Dr. Smith's career came after he received his Masters Degree in Orthodontics (M.S.D.) from the University of Washington. His graduate work in implantology gained him the coveted Milo Hellman International Research Award presented each year by the American Association of Orthodontists for the most outstanding orthodontic research. After graduation, Dr. Smith became interested in another area of orthodontics, "invisible braces". Working with five other noted orthodontists he helped pioneer the development of invisible braces. Through his publications and lectures, he has taught the theory of invisible braces and other innovations to thousands of orthodontists throughout the world. Dr. Smith holds membership in the American Association of Orthodontists (AAO), the American Lingual Orthodontic Association (ALOA), the Florida Society of Orthodontics, American Dental Association, Florida Dental Association, and the Orange County Dental Society.

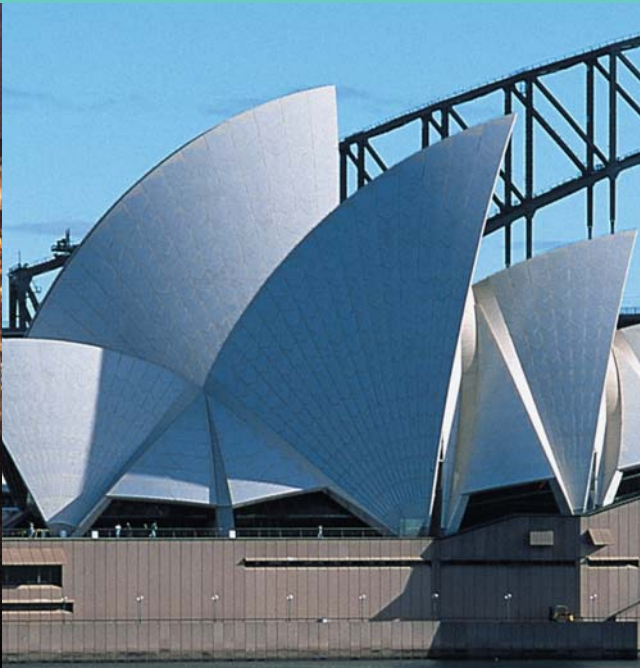
Sydney Harbour BridgeClimb
